On November 15, 2012 Cambodia Tribunal Monitor and Trial Observation Teams of the Documentation Center of Cambodia (DC-Cam) will host a workshop on CTM website at the InterED Institute with an attempt to disseminate the information related to the ongoing development of the Khmer Rouge Tribunal, raise awareness among the students of the trials of the Khmer Rouge leaders, and to encourage more effective utilization of its Cambodia Tribunal Monitor website (www.cambodiatribunal.org) for research purpose.

The workshop will take place at 2:00pm with participation from sixty students from various majors. To achieve meaningful participation from the participants, the team will prepare a range of activities, including a presentation on the history of the Khmer Rouge regime, and on-going development of the Khmer Rouge Tribunal. In addition, the team will screen one documentary film "Tuol Sleng Prison" for the students to reflect on the lives and experiences of the victims and survivors under the regime. Most importantly, the team will thoroughly present the key tools necessary to utilize the CTM website for research purpose. The workshop will put into an end with the floor given to students to ask questions and with a distribution of DC-Cam materials.
