On May 25, 2012 Cambodia Tribunal Monitor and Trial Observation Teams of the Documentation Center of Cambodia (DC-Cam) will host a workshop on CTM website at the Norton University with an attempt to disseminate the information related to the ongoing development of the Khmer Rouge Tribunal, raise awareness among Law students of the trials of the Khmer Rouge leaders, and to encourage more effective utilization of its website for research purpose.

The workshop will take place from 8:00-11:00 AM with participation from approximately one hundred students. To achieve a meaningful participation from the participants, CTM team will prepare a range of activities, starting with a presentation by Trial Observation team and followed by a discussion on the Khmer Rouge history and the reconciliation processes in Cambodia. In addition, the team will screen one documentary film "Tuol Sleng Prison" for the students to reflect on the lives and experiences of the victims and survivors under the regime. Most importantly, the team will thoroughly present the key tools necessary to utilize the CTM website for a research purpose. The workshop will put into an end with the floor given to students to ask questions and with a distribution of DC-Cam materials.
