"The migration-human capital nexus: skill & resource transfers from immigrants back to Cambodia" will be presented by Sok Serey. Students as well as the general public are welcome to attend this event.

Southeast Asians were some of the first refugees arriving in the United States of America with federal refugee assistance after the passage of the Refugee Act of 1980. A large population from Cambodia entered the United States in the 1980s as a result of one of the greatest tragedies of the twentieth century. This presentation gives a better understanding about Cambodian immigrants in U.S.; explores on how Cambodian immigrants making communication and send remittances back to Cambodia; and, examines skill transfers and plans for return to Cambodia in the future.

Serey Sok is a scholar at UTI (Malaysia) and MIT (USA) for Malaysia Sustainable Cities Program and a lecturer at the Royal University of Phnom Penh, Cambodia. He was a CEU/HESP Visiting Fellow in Hungary between April and July 2016. In 2014, he was a Visiting Scholar at Center for Studies in Demography and Ecology, University of Washington, Seattle, USA. He earned his PhD from Hong Kong Baptist University (Hong Kong) in 2013 and MSC from Asian Institute of Technology (Thailand) in 2005. Since 1999, Serey has worked with various national and international organizations including Women Development Association (Cambodia), UN Refugee Agency, UN-ESCAP Building (Bangkok) and National AIDS Authority under UNIADS Project (Cambodia). Serey's papers have been published by various International peer-reviewed including: Journal of Water Resources Development, Singapore Journal of Tropical Geography, Forum for Development Studies, Journal of Asian Public Policy, Journal or Development and Migration, Advances in Global Change Research, Journal of AIDS and HIV Research, Nova Science Publishers, SEPHIS e-magazine and LAP LAMBERT Academic Publishing AG & Co. KG Dudweiler.
