

"From the United States to Democratic Kampuchea: Returning to the Homeland" will be presented by Cindy Coleman. Students as well as the general public are welcome to attend this event.

In 1975, there were a large number of Cambodian military men studying at various military installations in the United States. When the Lon Nol government fell to the Khmer Rouge, the Cambodian military men were moved by the U.S. government to a refugee camp in California. 114 Cambodians there asked to be repatriated to Cambodia.

Ms. Cindy Coleman was the Project Director for the group while they remained in the U.S. She worked with the UNHCR and the U.S. Department of State until the military men were repatriated to Cambodia in the Spring of 1976.
