Memories of Cham Muslim Women after the Khmer Rouge

It is a goal of Documentation Center of Cambodia (DC-Cam) to train a generation of young Cambodians to produce valuable research, and ultimately to publish books on a par with international scholarly standards. Our Research and Publications Project aims to: a) serve as a resource on the history of Democratic Kampuchea, b) produce scholarly publications, generate scholarly exchange, catalyze training, and create opportunities for our staff to pursue advanced degrees, c) provide a cross-check and confirmation of Khmer Rouge primary documents, and d) provide a broader overall understanding of the Democratic Kampuchea regime.

Given the experience levels of DC-Cam researchers, our strategy is to comb primary and secondary sources, and to conduct interviews with Khmer Rouge victims and perpetrators, in order to assemble a thorough empirical record of data that can then be analyzed by scholars. It takes a great deal of time, training, and experience to produce sophisticated theoretical analyses, but we hope that over time, our researchers will increasingly be able to carry out studies of the more analytical variety.

VICTIMS AND PERPETRATORS

The Testimony of Young Khmer Rouge Cadres

In Democratic Kampuchea's Region 31, the Khmer Rouge recruited children to serve as guards, "catchers," and animal husbandry workers in Tuol Sleng Prison (S-21). This monograph explores how these and other Cambodian youth were forced to become Khmer Rouge cadres, how they were indoctrinated in the ideology of Democratic Kampuchea, how they were affected, and the violation of their rights.

Our first Khmer translation:

FIRST THEY KILLED MY FATHER

A Daughter of Cambodia Remembers

In this book, Loung Ung tells the story of her life under the Khmer Rouge. When she was five years old, she and her family were forced to leave their comfortable life in Phnom Penh when the Khmer Rouge took control of the country. Ms. Ung was trained as a child soldier, while her other siblings were sent to labor camps. After the regime fell, she and her surviving siblings slowly reunited.

THE KHMER ROUGE RICE FIELDS

The Story of Rape Survivor Tang Kim

One night, newly married Tang Kim was told by the Khmer Rouge that she was being taken to live with her soldier husband. But instead, she and eight other women were sent to a rice field near her village for execution. Huddled on a dike with only one soldier to guard her, Tang Kim heard the screams of the other women being raped. Knowing she would be next, Tang Kim begged her guard for protection. But the other soldiers returned and raped her as well.
